Woodland Hills School District wins 2021 National Best of Green Schools Award

June 30, 2021 – The Woodland Hills School District is excited to announce it has won the 2021 Best of Green Schools Award from the Green Schools National Network and Center for Green Schools. The national award recognizes the district for its work in organizing, educating, and collaborating with the community on green initiatives like sustainability, climate change, energy efficiency, and more.

Woodland Hills was the first school district in Pennsylvania to have its school board pass climate change resolution. In a press release from the U.S. Green Building Council and Green Schools National Network announcing the national awards, the District was praised for creating, “professional development courses to aid educators in creating climate change lessons for their classrooms and established a climate-friendly food program, recycling infrastructure, gardening programs and energy efficient building policies. Additionally, the Woodland Hills High School Climate Action Team launched a virtual Youth Climate Action Summit in October 2020, gaining nearly 200 attendees and raising more than \$1,500 for climate projects.”

The Woodland Hills Opportunity Camp

"The Woodland Hills Opportunity Camp is a no-cost summer program for rising first through eighth grade students in the district. The camp offers a structured environment for students to enhance their reading, writing, and math skills while emphasizing social-emotional development and presenting the concepts in a fun manner. The camp has also partnered with various community members to provide enrichment activities like engineering, West African drumming and dance, soccer, art and ceramics, and more. Students in grades K-3 have math and literature instruction in the morning with their enrichment activities in the afternoon. Students in grades 4-7 have activities and enrichment in the morning with their math and literature instruction in the afternoon. The month-long program ran through July 30 at Dickson Preparatory STEAM Academy in Swissvale."
