# Storytime in the Garden!

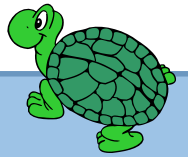

**WHAT WE DO**

- 1. DETECT & INTERRUPT POTENTIALLY VIOLENT CONFLICTS**  
 Trained violence interrupters & outreach workers prevent shootings by identifying & mediating potentially lethal conflicts in the community & following up to ensure that the conflict does not reignite.
- 2. IDENTIFY & TREAT HIGHEST RISK**  
 Trained, culturally-appropriate outreach workers work with the highest risk to make them less likely to commit violence by meeting them where they are at, talking to them about the costs of using violence, & helping them to obtain the social services they need – such as job training & drug treatment.
- 3. MOBILIZE THE COMMUNITY TO CHANGE NORMS**  
 Workers engage leaders in the community as well as community residents, local business owners, faith leaders, service providers, & the high risk, conveying the message that the residents, groups & the community do not support the use of violence.

**REFERRAL RATES FOR YOUTH | NATIONAL VS LOCAL (2018)**

Local referral rates for Black youth are higher than national rate for Black youth, while local referral rates for White youth are lower than national rate.

**INTENDED OUTCOMES WILL INCLUDE:**

- An increase in access for pre-arrest services that reduce the number of youth involved in systems.
- A reduction in the number of juveniles referred to juvenile court, citations, and arrests.
- A significant reduction in or complete elimination of the racial disparities seen in referrals to the Allegheny County juvenile justice system.
